## Recipe for Tea Loaf - Class 810

250 g mixed dried fruit, 100 g dark brown sugar, 225 ml strong hot black tea, pinch salt, $1 / 4$ tsp ground cinnamon, $1 / 4$ tsp ground nutmeg, 1 large egg (beaten), 250g self-raising flour.

## METHOD

Put the dried fruit and sugar into a heatproof mixing bowl and add the tea. Leave overnight to soak.

Heat the oven to $160^{\circ} \mathrm{C} / 325^{\circ} \mathrm{F} /$ Gas 3 . Grease and line 450 g (1lb) tin. Add the salt, spices, and egg to the soaked fruit. Stir well. Mix in the flour then pour into prepared tin. Bake for approx. 1 hour.
