

It's time to get ahead and prep a few areas in readiness for the changing season...... lets take a look at our wet areas.....containers and our greenhouses and coldframes..... they really are on the good jobs to get done list!

Clear out the pond weeds, & leave them heaped at the side of the pond so wildlife can return to the water. Cover with net to protect the water from leaves & Autumn debris.



Greenhouse, cold frame & polytunnel housekeeping might seem like the last thing on the "to-do" list, but if you have suffered with tomato blight or other baddies then you want to ensure that these aren't harbouring over the Autumn. (don't compost any plants that have suffered - they need to be burnt/green bin).

You don't need anything fancy & costly - just elbow grease and time!

After emptying, start at the top of the structure & work your way down to floor level.

- Check outside gutterings are clear & secure
- Sweep down cobwebs from the framework and any staging that you may have
- Sweep out the floor area
- Wash all surfaces with hot water and a mild detergent
- Leave vented to dry thoroughly

DON'T FORGET TO CHECK YOUR GREENHOUSE HEATERS ARE IN WORKING ORDER











Containers must have adequate drainage – raise the pots onto pot feet now – cold, wet compost won't help your container plants over the colder months. Consider topping up the compost levels if they have dropped over the Summer.
